	The chair, L. Mille, called the special work session in order to put together a pocket card training aid for EMS providers in the PEMS Region. The card would serve a dual purpose. 1) As a reminder of the Trauma Triage Transport Decision criteria and 1) provide an easy to remember outline for providers to give a rapid patient report upon arrival at a trauma center. VCU, MWHC, RRMC and SNG all provided various aids for these purposes. There was a great deal of animated discussion surrounding the reasons for designing and distributing the cards and any expected outcomes, to what information should or should not be included on it. There was a consensus that these cards should initiate a larger training mission within the region as a whole to address any provider or administrator knowledge gaps when it comes to which patients require transport to a trauma center. It was decided that everyone liked the size and format of the card MWHC uses, but did not want to have quite as much of the detailed information on triage decision criteria on the back. VCUs MIST reporting card and RRMCs MIVT were the preferred reporting formats. The final decision was to make a card the size/style of MWHC; to use the wording from our Trauma Triage Policy in the PEMS Protocol for triage decisions and to include the MIVT format	Required	Whom/When
New Business	D. Belvin suggested we consider a change to our protocol to include the Virginia Trauma Triage Decision Scheme on the actual protocol, not just in the administrative section. Discussion. Since the 2018 protocols will be voted on by the MAC at their September meeting, so the earliest we could make the change would be for the 2019 protocol rollout. L. Miller asks that we make this as decision at our December 2017 meeting and submit for inclusion in the next rollout if all members of TTF agree.
